Manufacturing Readiness Grant program extended

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation (IEDC) has announced the extension of the state's Manufacturing Readiness Grant program, in partnership with Conexus Indiana, for another two years. The program supports technology-based capital investment by Hoosier manufacturers. Since launch, nearly \$7 million has been awarded to 87 companies to modernize operations, including Internet of Things, cloud computing, artificial intelligence, and cobots. Another \$20 million has been appropriated to extend the program. Applications are open now.

Ribbon cuttings held in Kendallville

Two more businesses celebrated new location openings in Kendallville in early June. El Mariachi Grill, a popular downtown eatery in Albion, opened their second location on US 6 in the plaza where Tractor Supply is located. A ribbon cutting was held there on June 8 to mark their opening. Just a few days later a ribbon was cut at Hosler Realty on Main Street downtown in Kendallville. Hosler has been a part of the community since 1938 but recently purchased and remodeled the former Weible Paint and Wallpaper storefront at 106 S. Main Street to serve as their new office. Both ribbon cuttings were coordinated as a service of the Kendallville Chamber of Commerce.





Workforce development guide

Created by the USDA Rural Development Innovation Center, a new Resource Guide has been published that includes a comprehensive matrix of various loan and grant programs as well as case studies. The guide is aimed at helping for-profit and non-profit entities develop, in rural communities, in a variety of areas including customers; workforce development planning; infrastructure and equipment; industry and employer engagement; entrepreneurship; education, training, and apprenticeships.

More development coming to Kendallville

Four new facade grants have been approved by Kendallville Redevelopment Commission, as well as a \$25,000 investment in a new downtown park. The Commission approved, in early June, grants totaling over \$37,000 for owner updates to the Young Family Funeral Home, Carla's 5 Bucks Antiques and Such, Splash-N-Dash Car Wash, and the former Blue Heron ice cream parlor. The Commission's approved investment in a new pocket park downtown will help spur revitalization of a now vacant lot at the corner of Main and Rush Streets.

Central Noble Food Pantry has completed the remodeling of a building at 601 N. Orange Street in Albion and relocated to the new site. The pantry will be open every Friday from noon to 2 p.m., or until the last person has been served. The move provides more space and parking to serve, on average, about 35 families each week in the community.

A vacancy on the Noble County Board of Commissioners has been filled by **Dave Dolezal**. Dolezal will fill the remainder of Justin Stump's term as Stump leaves to become executive director of Noble County Emergency Management, a position Mick Newton retired from in June. Dolezal is not new to the Board, having served as Commissioner previously. He was defeated by Stump in the Republican Primary after serving from 2011 to 2018. Dolezal and his wife have lived in Ege for 42 years. Joanna Claudy will lead the Noble County 4-H and youth development programs. Claudy replaces Doug Keenan following his recent retirement after 30 years of service. Claudy was a 10-year member of 4-H in Steuben County and is a graduate of Prairie Heights High School. She graduated from Purdue University with a bachelor's degree in animal science, and from Ohio State University with a master's in extension education.
