Ordinance makes way for commercial solar projects

A new ordinance that was weeks in the making, requiring multiple rounds of revisions based on many meetings and public hearings, was ultimately, unanimously passed by Noble County Commissioners on November 22.

The new Noble County ordinance, which

follows another recently adopted allowing residential and other non-commercial solar power installations, sets the stage for the county to entertain proposals for commercial solar field projects. Noble County boasts nearly 230,000 acres of property zoned for agricultural use and is home to more 1,000 acre farms than any other neighboring county in Northeast Indiana.
