

Conveniently located in the Crossroads of America, Noble County, Indiana offers a competitive

business environment and exceptional quality of life.





Noble County has the third highest population in the 11-county Northeast Indiana Region. Businesses and residents enjoy easy access to some of the nations longest highways, plus air and rail services. Living here is affordable and enjoyable, with 117 lakes across the county.

Noble County is home to more 1,000-acre farms and lakes than any other northeast Indiana county and a destination for outdoor and lakeside living enthusiasts. The county is located a short 35 minute drive north of Fort Wayne, Indiana's second largest city, with easy access to more outstanding amenities and entertainment options.

Manufacturing roots run deep in Noble County. Nearly 40% of the workforce is employed in advanced manufacturing, food and beverage, automotive, medical device technology, and other industries. The county ranks as one of the top five in the nation for its high concentration of employment in manufacturing.

Kendallville, the largest community, is conveniently located 11 miles west of Interstate 69 and 30 minutes from the Indiana Toll Road. The East Industrial Park is served by the Norfolk Southern rail line and the Kendallville Municipal airport (with heated hanger and 4,400' runway). Kendallville is home to an 89-acre, world-class Outdoor Recreation Complex, Bixler Lake Park, and a growing, paved trail system offering great walkability.

Ligonier is the second-largest city in Noble County. It boasts the highest density of manufacturing jobs and a diverse population. This "City of Murals" boasts nearly 40 art installations in the downtown district, many honoring Jewish settlers and founders, its thriving Amish community, and Hispanic families that comprise over half of the local population.

Avilla is Noble County's fastest growing community. The bedroom community is a short drive north of Fort Wayne. The county's newest industrial park is found in Avilla.

Albion, the county seat, is bustling on weekdays and a tourist destination on weekends. Chain O'Lakes State Park, just south of town, welcomes hundreds of thousands of visitors each year. The town's centerpiece, the beautiful and historic courthouse, sits in the center of a vibrant downtown featuring multiple restaurants. The county's largest employer, with over 1,000 workers, is located in the Albion's industrial park.

Rome City, situated along the west shore of Sylvan Lake, draws year-round and seasonal lake residents and remote workers. Entrepreneurism thrives in this historic lake community.



WORKFORCE BY SECTOR






