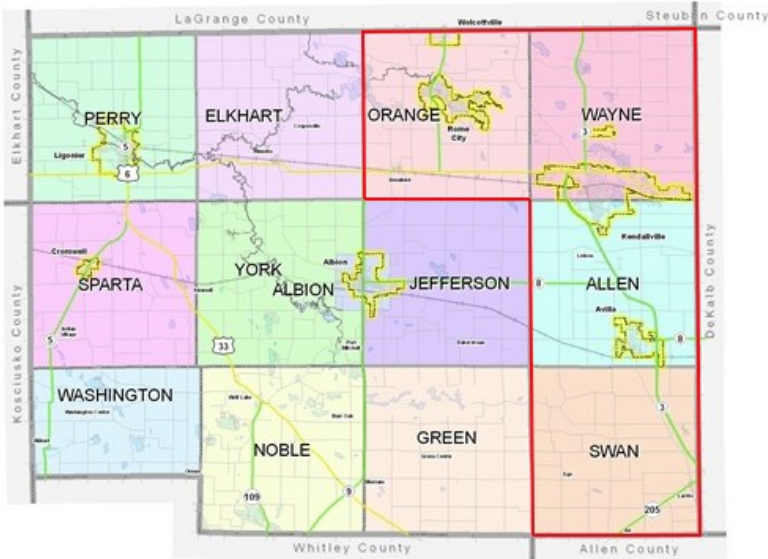

Digital Promise

Selected to the League of Innovative Schools, East Noble pioneers innovative learning and leadership practices that lead to improved outcomes for students and help prepare them for learning for life.

The entire district is 1:1. Students in grades K-4 use iOS tablet. Students in grades 5-12 use Windows laptops. Students in grades 5-12 keep devices over the summer. Since initiating the 1:1 program, East Noble's graduation rate has risen from just over 80% to over 90% consistently. Many female students have become involved in "Girls That Code", some advancing to national competition two years in a row.



Through a competitive application process, East Noble was chosen to receive Project RED's support and guidance on education technology implementations, focusing specifically on 1:1 computing deployments.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS



As a district, East Noble focuses on science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) in all schools. South Side Elementary is highlighted on the [US Department of Education website](#).

All schools have robotics clubs in which students compete against other school students. Some have advanced to state competition. The high school also features a F.I.R.S.T. Robotics program, sponsored in part by local industrial employers.



East Noble High School's graduation rate qualifies it to be recognized by the Indiana Department of Education as a Performance Quality School, eliminating the restriction of 180 school days and allowing innovative, unique learning experiences for students and staff.



Juniors and seniors at East Noble High School have the opportunity to participate in classes at the Impact Institute to develop career and technical education skills. Students can choose from 22 courses to earn college course credits. Dual credits are earned by those attending the Impact Institute, as well as certifications qualifying them to begin working upon graduation.



In fall 2019, East Noble High School was recognized as a National Banner Unified Champions School, one of just 14 in Indiana and 173 in the nation. The unified teams, composed of students with disabilities and students of abled abilities, compete together.



East Noble Schools Superintendent Ann Linson was named one of "20 to Watch" by the National School Boards Association in 2012.
