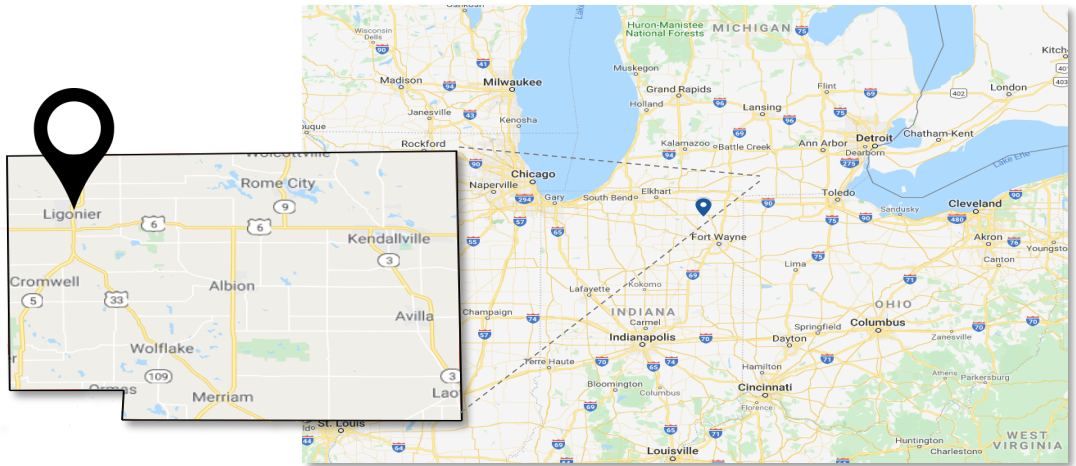


LIGONIER

NOBLE COUNTY, INDIANA

Ligonier, in western Noble County, is home to 4,568 residents. Described as a “hidden gem in Amish Country” by a travel writer, Ligonier is known for its Jewish and German heritage as well. Today, less than 50% of the population identifies as “White alone”, according to 2020 US Census data.

Ligonier is located along US 6, one of the longest highways in America. Nearby is US 33. Thirty miles north is the RV Capital of the World, Elkhart. Because of its proximity, Ligonier has the highest density of manufacturing jobs in Noble County. The Indiana Toll Road is 30 miles north and the Norfolk Southern Railway runs through the north side of town and the city's industrial park.

Top employers in Ligonier include Forest River RV, TI Automotive, Tenneco, and Carlex Glass. Though automotive supply is a major industrial sector, there is diversity here. Star of the West Milling, Silgan Plastics, and Jeld Wen produce flour, plastic bottles, and windows respectively. One of the most notable small businesses in Noble County is Annie Oakley Natural Perfumery. It is also located in Ligonier.

Ligonier earned its nickname “City of Murals” by featuring nearly 40 original artworks on and inside buildings in the city. In recent years, the city has been successful leveraging funding opportunities to complete a variety of



community improvement projects including new waterworks systems, the Strawberry Valley Cultural Trail, and a new fire station. An active summer farmers market takes place near the Elkhart River in downtown's Pettit Park.

Kenney Memorial Park is home to the Ligonier Recreation Center with offers a splash pad, ball diamonds, disc golf, and more.

Noble County is destination for outdoor recreation and a short drive from Fort Wayne, Indiana's second largest city and home to world-class sports, arts, and other amenities. A short trip north is Shipshewana, a well-known destination for tourists in the heart of the region's hard-working and vibrant Amish community.
