## Major step for Noble housing growth

Be Noble Inc., Noble County's local economic development organization, has taken a major step in an effort to launch housing initiatives that will meet local needs. The organization has signed a two-year contract with Housing Resource Hub (aka "the Hub") and will soon launch the Housing Coalition of Noble County, a group of stakeholders tasked with the development of a road map to put vision into action to enhance housing options across the county and grow the population.

#### **Robby Morgan**

#### CN names Morgan superintendent

Robby Morgan has been named the new superintendent of Central Noble Schools. Morgan served for the past six years as principal of Central Noble Primary School and, prior to that, was assistant principal at Prairie Heights Middle School and Goshen Community Schools. Morgan was also a teacher at West Noble Elementary. He will assume the new role on July 1 and succeeds outgoing superintendent Troy Gaff.

#### Medical manufacturing coming to Merriam

SSM Implants LLC announced plans to bring the production of bone plates and screws to an existing industrial building located in Merriam, south of Albion. Owners Jerry Busche and Wes Spiess explained to Noble County Council members that they purchased Single Source, Inc., a medical tool manufacturer in Liberty, Indiana, and will expand the company's capacity locally by adding multiple new precision CNC machines and upgrading real property. Investments of \$5,000,000 in new equipment and \$650,000 in property improvements were approved for five-year and 10-year tax abatements respectively by council members on May 2. The company expects to hire at least 25 workers initially with jobs paying an average of \$28.85 per hour and to ramp up production later this year.

#### Plans announced for trail expansion

#### Kendallville to Avilla

Representatives of Noble Trails addressed residents in Avilla recently to discuss the proposed expansion of the Fishing Line Trail from Kendallville to Avilla. The project would add 5.15 miles to the trail that already connects Rome City to Kendallville. Multiple options for crossing State Road 3 were shown on a map shared at the community meeting. After receiving public input, Noble Trails will need to get assistance through local donors in order to move the project forward. Cost estimates are not yet available.

#### Albion passes solar ordinance

The Albion Town Council has approved a new ordinance governing commercial, residential and business solar operations within its zoning jurisdiction, which includes two miles past corporation boundaries. The ordinance closely resembles the one passed by Noble County this spring in terms of set-backs and other distance considerations but is a bit more stringent on some items.

### Fort Wayne Newspapers acquires KPC Media publications

Multiple northern Indiana newspapers, websites, social media platforms, niche magazines, phone books and other publications are among the acquisitions of Fort Wayne Newspapers from KPC Media. The companies announced the sale in mid-May saying the acquisition will mean all KPC publications will become products of Fort Wayne Newspapers. The Ogden Newspapers own controlling interests in the company. Editors and reporters will reportedly continue to work in and serve the communities currently served by KPC Media under the new structure.
