Noble County government vacancies filled

Gary Timmerman was selected by Republican caucus to serve the remainder of Dave Dolezal's term as a Noble County Commissioner. Dolezal passed away unexpectedly on November 14 following a successful bid for re-election earlier in the month. Timmerman hails from Avilla and is a "semi-retired" businessman. Natasha Zizelman, also from Avilla, was selected by the caucus to serve as Noble County Treasurer. Shelly Mawhorter vacates that office to assume the role of Noble County Auditor, a seat she won in the November election. Zizelman has worked for four years in the Noble County Assessor's office.

Bruce Richman, an Albion native and Price Risk Manager for Ceres Solutions in Wabash, has been named 2022 Petroleum Professional of the Year by CountryMark. The award was announced at the company's awards banquet on November 19 in Indianapolis. Albion and Kendallville park departments are currently supporting community efforts to raise funds to add skateparks to their recreational offerings. The Albion Skatepark Project is currently seeking tax deductible donations, eligible for a dollar for dollar match up to \$50,000 through February 2023. The new park is set to be constructed at Hidden Diamonds Park. The cost of the Albion project is \$160,000. More information is available at <u>www.albionparks.com</u>. A Kendallville group is looking to raise \$300,000 to build and endow a new skatepark at the Kendallville Outdoor Recreation Complex. Fundraising for this project will begin soon. An account has been set up by the city to receive donations.

The Community Foundation of Noble County has announced an incentive to contribute to grow local endowment funds. Donations to endowment funds held at the Foundation will be matched, dollar for dollar, up to \$5,000 per fund now through May 1, 2023, or until \$50,000 total has been matched. The matching gifts offer an opportunity to help create a more thriving community by allowing all community members to pitch in.

Kendallville City Council President Jim Dazey announced his retirement, effective at the end of his 2023 term. Dazey has served the community for 27 years. His departure comes at the same time as Mayor SuzAnne Handshoe, who announced she will not seek re-election.

Noble Countians came together for Power of the Purse, raising over \$29,000 to make a difference. In partnership with local businesses, Crossroads United Way made this event possible. More than 200 people attended the annual event and bid on 51 purse packages.

Four Parkview Health hospitals, including Parkview Noble, have received an "A" in the Leapfrog Group's fall 2022 Hospital Safety Grade. The "A" grade. The new result marks an improvement for the Kendallville hospital since the spring grading period, evident of continuous improvement efforts.

Hosler Realty's Christmas Tree Jubilee raised more than \$22,500 for Helping Hands, the Orange Township food (and more) pantry. The event was the second hosted by the locally owned business in their headquarters on Main Street in Kendallville. Helping Hands serves about 70 families each week.
