County invests in child care

Noble County's Board of Commissioners took a major step recently, one that may be the first of its kind in Indiana. The county appropriated \$50,000 to support a pilot program to address child care affordability. Noble Thrive by 5 developed the "Tri-Share Program" based on similar models in Michigan. The program improves the affordability of child care for families by splitting costs



into thirds. One third is paid by the county, one third by the employer, and a third by the family. The program is set to launch in 2023. Troup named GM at LigTel

LigTel Communications announced several personnel promotions recently, including that of Mike Troup to General Manager. Indiana shut out of USDA broadband funding

Officials at LigTel Communications confirmed late last week that not only was LigTel unsuccessful in a recent attempt at federal funding for additional broadband expansion in Northeast Indiana, no one else in Indiana was successful either. The Agriculture Department announced \$759 million in grants and loans to enable rural communities to access high-speed internet, part of a \$65 billion push for connectivity from last year's infrastructure law. New construction on US 6 east

Demolition of the former Preferred Auto dealership at US 6 and Riley Street in Kendallville has cleared the way for a new, drive-thru coffee shop to come to town. Scooter's Coffee site construction plans illustrate a kiosk-style coffee shop with two drive-up lanes. Scooter's has locations in Nappanee, Logansport, and Portland.



Request for tax break moves forward

Carla Lowe, owner of Carla's 5 Buck Antiques, has received a recommendation for approval of her application for a tax reduction to help launch a new business in two formerly vacant buildings on Kendallville's Main Street. The properties at 101 N Main and 103 N Main, formerly Relaxation Station and Rudy's Bar and Grill, are undergoing renovations with plans to launch a restaurant/brewery sometime in the foreseeable future. Lowe's request will require final approval from Kendallville City Council.

More facade improvements coming

Two more buildings in Historic Downtown Kendallville, and another on Albion's Main Street, will be receiving upgrades funded in part by grants from the Kendallville and Albion Redevelopment Commissions.

In Kendallville, the "Shanower building", formerly occupied by Modern Printing,

will be reimbursed a portion of costs to replace 136 panes of glass, by hand, that make up the building's large windows, as well as brick repairs. The former A&G Supply store on Kendallville's Main Street, which has already seen some work completed, was also approved for tuckpointing and cleaning work. In Albion, the building at 108 E Main Street, owned by Josh and Arian Gunder and home to Reds Rusty Nail Boutique since July, will install outside steps and a deck as part of a renovation project that will ultimately create three new, second floor apartments within the historic structure.

Jeremy Weaver, Ligonier Fire Chief, is credited and applauded for taking the lead to complete the project. The Ligonier Baby Box is one of 89 in Indiana. Another is located at the Kendallville Fire Department at 304 E North Street.

Noble County Plan Director Teresa Tackett hosted a meeting of the Permitting Excellence Coalition at the Noble County Annex in downtown Albion recently. Members of the Coalition from across the region attended to work on creating consistency in permitting processes across the region to make projects easier for contractors, as well as sharing best planning and development practices throughout towns, cities, and counties in Northeast Indiana.
