Plea agreement could boost tourism

If Ketankumar R. Patel, former owner of the Holiday Inn Express in Kendallville, is a man of his word, the Noble County Convention and Visitors Bureau will recover about \$80,000 in unpaid innkeeper's tax. Patel failed to submit taxes collected by the hotel over a multi-year period and was subsequently prosecuted for the Level 6 Felony. In a plea agreement confirmed by Judge Steven Clouse last week, Patel agreed to pay \$80,903 in full on or before


