#### **Hendrickson to invest \$17M+**

Hendrickson, located in the Kendallville East Industrial Park, has announced plans to add 133,000 square feet of production space and invest \$1.8 million in new equipment to furnish it. The project, slated for completion by next spring, represents a total investment of more than \$17 million dollars and is expected to add 50 new jobs.

# Tax break approved for new mill

The City of Ligonier approved two 10-year tax abatements for real and personal property in support of Star of the West's major expansion project announced recently. The project represents what is believed to be the largest single industrial investment in decades in Noble County,



bringing an estimated increase in assessed values of \$122.3 million. Star of the West will build an all-new flour mill and add new capacity in the Ligonier Industrial Park.

# Wages remain low in Indiana

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation and local economic development organizations, including Be Noble, are consistently focused on building talent development systems to create a highly skilled workforce in order to retain and attract jobs that pay well. Such strategies are supported by the latest wage study released by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics that show Northeast Indiana's counties, for the most part, lag well below the state and national averages for wages paid.

# Central Noble approves child care

The Central Noble School Board has approved a partnership that will help working parents with children enrolled at the schools. The Boys and Girls Club of Elkhart County will set up a KidsCare operation at the Central Noble Elementary School this fall. The program will provide before-school care from 5:30 a.m. until classes begin for K-6th Grade students, as well as after-school care from the time classes are released until 5:30 p.m. Costs for care will be \$55 per week for one time period, or \$75 for both, per student. Bus service will be provided to those who attend classes at Central Noble Primary in Wolf Lake.

# Kendallville to launch county's first coworking space

The Kendallville Redevelopment Commission has committed \$102,000 to acquire a building on Historic Downtown Kendallville's Main Street for the purpose of developing a coworking space. Funds will be granted over a two-year period to Historic Downtown Kendallville (HDK) to purchase, then remodel, the former car dealership at the corner of Main and Rush Streets. HDK is collaborating with Eskywell Consulting, a company with several successful coworking spaces in Michigan and Ohio. HDK and Be Noble Inc. have already been successful in attaining grants to help with some costs of the project.
