#### City to serve as "legal go-between" on housing effort

The Kendallville City Council agreed to partner with Inspiration Ministries in an effort to bring apartments to Historic Downtown Kendallville. By a unanimous vote, council members agreed the city would serve as a lead applicant for a grant proposal to Indiana's Office of Community and Rural Affairs (OCRA) that could enable 13 to 15 men, graduates of Inspiration's recovery program, to live downtown. The city is not required nor planning to invest funding, but can serve as the legal grant applicant, making Inspiration a sub-recipient of \$750,000 in funding.

Noble County nominees included Brooke Straessle, Angela Taylor, Stephanie Sanders, Tonia Chiddister, and Yova Teusch. Nominations open for the next round in October.

The **Jack and Mary Metzger family** was recently named the 2023 Grand Marshal of the Wolf Lake Onion Days festival and parade. Jack and Mary took over their dairy farm near Wolf Lake in 1960 from Jack's parents, starting with a few cows. Their sons, **John and Dutch**, took over operations in the 1980s and have expanded the Metzger Dairy to about 1,200 cows. The dairy was recently in the news for the planned construction of an anaerobic digester system that will produce renewable natural gas (RNG) on site.

The Albion Town Council has given its unanimous support to the creation of the **Albion Youth Advisory Council**. The effort, led by Councilwoman Abby Lindsey and Town

Manager Jacob Ihrie, is also being supported by Central Noble social studies teacher Randy

Handshoe. Students in grades 7-12 will have the opportunity to meet routinely and lead

projects within the Albion community once the program is up and running. The town will

fund food and beverages for the meetings.

One10 West Main owners Ashley and Anne Peterson recently heard the roar of Prince, a tiger and resident of Black Pine Animal Sanctuary in Albion. Prince, suffering from a

detached retina and cataracts, could regain his sight, but for the high costs of the surgery needed. The folks at One10, in response, held a "Tigerloin" special on August 15 and raised \$4,000 to cover the costs, exceeding the need by more than \$1,000. The additional funds will be used for pre-surgery dental work Prince also needs. Community investment to the rescue!
