Reliable Tool expansion planned

Kendallville Common Council has approved a tax abatement for Reliable Tool for a \$1.1 million investment the company plans at their Ohio Street location. New equipment will enable the addition of six new jobs. The tax break will be delivered over the course of five years on a sliding scale. Reliable currently employs 132 people with a payroll of over \$7.2 million annually.



















Get a "sneak peek" of Kendallville's new co-working space

More than 150 acres of upland prairie and wetland has been added to the Mallard Roost Wetland Conservation Area in Noble County, according to the Indiana Department of Natural Resources. The habitat will provide opportunities for fishing and hunting, as well as protect a larger scope of grassland, forest, and wetland habitat for generations to come. The news comes not long after reports that Indiana has lost more than 260 acres of wetlands since protections were removed by legislators in 2021.

LaOtto Community Park has been seeing new life in recent months with the installation of a new playground and, more recently, the return of youth baseball.
