#### Costs stall Albion's child care project

The Town of Albion has tabled efforts to bring a new child care center to the community. Project costs reportedly proved more than the town could fund. Thrive by 5, the child care coalition serving Noble and LaGrange counties, will nonetheless keep moving forward with plans to apply for grants totaling \$1.3 million.



#### New preschool gets funding boost

West Noble Nature Preschool, a new program in Ligonier that places emphasis on a nature-inspired approach to learning, has received a \$30,000 grant from the Community Foundation of Noble County. Funding. The preschool is operating Monday through Thursday as a partnership of Cole Center Family YMCA and West Noble School Corporation to enhance early learning and vital brain development before the age of five. A similar program is offered at Merry Lea Environmental Learning Center through a partnership with Cole Center Family YMCA and Central Noble Primary School. School board members approved the investment, with the Noble County Community Foundation matching up to \$5,000 of the amount the school will contribute to help offset the costs of child care needs for school employees.
